

Air quality monitoring	 Real-time air quality monitoring 	 The real-time air quality TEOM monitors in Stratford and Craven villages continue to operate. SCPL has established alarming and a response protocol for the real-time dust monitoring system. General ambient PM10 dust levels have been elevated due to ongoing drought conditions. Elevated PM10 levels have also been recorded from smoke during recent bushfires.

	Blast Results	 No blasts exceeded 115dB(L) or 5mm/s during the quarter. For the annual reporting period no blasts have exceed 115dB(L) or 5mm/s. No blasts recorded any levels of fume during the quarter.
	Blasting Preparations	 A Road Closure management plan has been prepared and approved by MidCoast Council for road closures during blasting along Wenham Cox Rd. The road closure plan will be updated prior to blast activities in the Roseville Pit. Blast notifications have continued.

Monitoring	Monthly Noise Survey	 Monthly attended noise monitoring was undertaken during Q3 2019. No non-compliant results were recorded during the surveys. Reports will be made available on the Stratford Coal website. The next monitoring is scheduled in November 2019.
Real-Time Noise	Real-Time Noise System	 Real-time noise monitors continue to operate near Stratford village, Craven Village and the Clarke property. The integrated real-time noise management system is operational. The system analyses monitoring data from the noise units, the weather station and the inversion towers and records times when either the noise criteria is likely to be exceeded or when noise enhancing weather conditions are present. The system will then provide alarms to staff to implement additional noise mitigation measures where required.





Site Water Management	 Stratford East Erosion and sediment control 	 Dewatering infrastructure has been established for Stratford East. Erosion and sediment control infrastructure will be constructed for the Stratford East pit during Q4 2019.
Water management Structures	Main Pit Flood BundStratford East clean	 The Main Pit Flood Bund construction was completed in August 2019. The flood bund design is based on the updated flood model for the Avondale Creek catchment. The Stratford East clean water drain construction commenced in September 2019.
	water drainStratford East PAF Cell	 A design is currently being prepared for the Stratford East PAF Cell. The PAF Cell is required to be approved by the EPA.
Surface Water Monitoring	 Routine monitoring Aquatic Ecology - Macroinvertebrates 	 Sporadic and low rainfall conditions persisted through winter/spring 2019. Routine water sampling continued. All results consistent with the SCM Environmental Assessment predictions. Generally "no flow" conditions have persisted across all sites since December 2018. Macroinvertebrates monitoring was undertaken in October 2019. The monitoring continues to indicate negligible impacts associated with mining activities. The results reflected the extended drought conditions.
Groundwater Monitoring	Routine monitoring	 Routine groundwater sampling continued. All results consistent with the SCM Environmental Assessment predictions.

Rehabilitated Waste Emplacements	Avon North waste emplacementBRN waste emplacement	 Bulk shaping of the Avon North waste emplacement has continued focusing on areas with offsite visual impact. Topsoil spreading will commence during November 2019 and will be followed by ground preparation and seeding. Planning for the BRN waste emplacement rehabilitation has commenced. Bulk shaping of the northern facing batters will be undertaken in Q4 2019. Topsoil spreading and seeding will be undertaken in 2020
Monitoring	 Vegetation Monitoring - Ecosystem Function Analysis 	 Rehabilitation monitoring incorporating landscape function analysis and vegetation dynamics was undertaken during May 2019. The final report is currently being prepared and a summary will be included in the Annual Review.

Mining Lease Areas	Habitat Assessments	 Habitat assessments have been undertaken in the Stratford East and Avon North proposed mining areas in advance of clearing.
	Vegetation Clearance	 Clearing permits were prepared in preparation for works in Stratford East. The clearing permits address the management of vegetation, fauna, heritage sites and topsoil. Vegetation clearance for Stratford East Stage 1 commenced in September 2019 The next stages of clearing for Avon North will be undertaken during Q1 2020
	Heritage Sites	 Prior to clearing in Stratford East, a previously identified scarred tree (ST-2) was required to be relocated in accordance with the HMP. The scarred tree relocation was undertaken in September 2019 in consultation with Forster Lands Council and an archaeologist. The scarred tree was relocated in the local area to a secure site that will not be impacted by future works.

Biodiversity Offset Area	 Revegetation Works 	 Planning for the tubestock planting in the biodiversity offset area for 2020 has commenced. Approximately 80 hectares along Glen Rd is proposed for planting. Native seed supply has been sourced and tubestock preparation will commence in October 2019.
Biodiversity Offset Area	 Vegetation Monitoring 	• The first round of vegetation monitoring for the biodiversity offset area was undertaken in February 2019. This report will establish the baseline vegetation condition for the ongoing revegetation works in the offset area. A summary of the report will be included in the next Annual Review.
	Fauna Monitoring	 Fauna monitoring in the Stratford biodiversity offset was undertaken during September to October 2019. The results will be included in the 2019 Annual Review.

Squirrel Glider Management	 Squirrel Glider Colony & Home Range Surveys Nest box installations & monitoring Hollow Bearing Tree Census 	 Squirrel Glider home range monitoring in the four colony locations was undertaken during March/April 2019 via a trapping and radio tracking program. 8 gliders from 4 colonies were tracked to determine their home ranges. The second round of radio tracking was completed in September 2019. These studies will guide the ongoing management of glider populations. During May 2019 30 Squirrel Glider boxes were installed surrounding the home ranges identified in the radio tracking program. Monitoring commenced in July 2019 and will be undertaken quarterly. A hollow bearing tree survey was undertaken in September 2019. The survey data will guide future habitat enhancement works.
Pest Control	 Wild Dog control program 	 Wild dog and fox trapping was recommenced in October 2019 covering all Stratford Coal owned properties including biodiversity offsets and Mining Leases.


